Position Statement on Doctrine

In our quest for revival and restoration, we recognize that before we can fully experience New Testament power, we must first return to New Testament patterns, principles and priorities. When the patterns are right, the Glory of God will manifest and His power will be released. The early Believers "continued steadfastly in the Apostle's Doctrine, in fellowship, the breaking of bread and in prayers." (Acts 2:42). As God restores these apostolic truths to His Church today, He is laying a foundation that can be built upon securely.

We must acknowledge that God is neither explained by nor limited to any set of doctrinal beliefs or statements. There is as well the danger, as church history has shown, of men limiting themselves by such articles, becoming unprepared to advance in God when the light of recovered truth begins to shine. We see the result of this in the many denominations and organizations around us. The trend among some, however, of declaring doctrine to be unnecessary or unimportant, is absolutely contrary to scripture. The Bible is clear on the importance of doctrine. It must not only be sound, pure and scriptural, but it must also be obeyed.

All beliefs have their roots in various teachings, true or false. These doctrines, when believed and practiced, determine not only our actions but also our character and ultimately our destiny. Many otherwise sincere people have been led into deception. Thus, it is essential for us to be fully established in the doctrines as set forth in the scriptures. When a believer is established in the Apostle's doctrine they will no longer be blown about by every wind of doctrine (Eph. 4:4) or become ensnared by the doctrines of demons (I Tim. 4:1).

(Titus 1:9,2:11; II Tim. 3; 14-17; I Tim. 4:6,13,16, 6:1-3)

Apostolic Doctrine

In this age of "easy believeism" what the world needs most is the reality of Jesus Christ and the true Gospel.

True Biblical Christianity is Pentecostal, Apostolic, and Oneness.

We believe in the one everlasting True God who has revealed Himself as the Father in creation: through the Son in redemption; and as the Holy Ghost at work in the lives of believers. The basic and fundamental doctrine of this ministry shall be the Bible standard of full salvation, which is repentance, baptism in water by immersion in the Name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and the baptism of the Holy Ghost with the evidence of speaking with other tongues as the Spirit gives the utterance.

Statement of Faith

We believe:

- In the One True and Living God who has manifested himself as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. (Dt 6:4; Mt 28:19, Lk 13:3, Jn 8:24)
- The Bible alone is the inspired, inerrant and infallible Word of God, our only guide to faith and conduct. (II Tim 3:16; II Pe 1:20-21)
- Created in the image and likeness of God, man was given authority and dominion over all creation. Through Adam's transgression, sin and death entered into the world, man's righteousness was lost and his authority and dominion were handed over to the devil. (Ge1:26-28; Ro 5:12; Lk 4:5-6)
- Because of his great love for us, God took upon himself the form of man and came to our aid. Thus, Jesus Christ, the only begotten Son of God-truly God, truly man-was conceived by the Holy Ghost, born of a virgin, was crucified, died and was buried. (Jn 3:16; Is 7:14; Jn 1:1-3; Jn 8:29; Acts 2:36; I Co 15:3,4)
- This same Jesus defeated Satan and all the powers of darkness, taking from them the keys of death and hell, and overcoming death itself, resurrected from the grave. No longer the only begotten Son, He arose the First-born from the dead, the First-born of a New Creation and First born of many brethren. (Rev 1:5,18; Col 1:15-18)
- Jesus ascended into heaven, giving gifts to men. Now seated at the right hand of the Father, making intercession for us all, He has sent forth his Spirit to indwell and empower believers. (Mk 16:19; Eph 4:8-11; Acts 2:33; Jn 16:7)
- As the King of kings and Lord of lords, Jesus is The Way, The Truth and The Life. You must be born again of water and the Spirit, receiving Him as Lord and Savior, in order to see the Kingdom of God. The righteousness, authority, and dominion, lost by Adam in the Garden of Eden, is now restored in Christ. (Jn 3:5; Acts 2:38; I Tim 6:15; Jn 14:6; Jn 3:3; II Co 5:17,21)
- Water baptism is by immersion in the Name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, in obedience to the direct command of the Word of God. In this ordinance, we are identified with our Lord in His death, burial, and resurrection. (Mk 16:15,16; Acts 2:38; 8:12; 10:48; 19:5; 22:16)
- His promise to baptize believers with the Holy Ghost and fire. According to the

scriptures and the experience of history, this is accompanied by the evidence of signs and wonders including speaking with other tongues, boldness to witness and ability to declare His Word in the demonstration of the Spirit and power. (Mt 3:11; Acts 1:4,5,8; Acts 2:4,38; Acts 4:31, I Co 2:4)

- All of the gifts of the spirit are functional in the church today, available to all believers. (I Co 12:1-12)
- In sanctification through the Word of God by the Holy Ghost, personal holiness and purity of heart and life. (Jn 15:3; I Th 4:3-4; I Pe 1:15)
- The substitutionary atonement of the Lord Jesus Christ paid not only for the salvation of our spirits but also for the healing of our bodies. Thus, divine healing, through faith in the Name of Jesus, is included in our redemption. (Is 53:4-5; Mt 8:17; I Pe 2:24)
- In the soon return of the Lord Jesus Christ, the resurrection of the dead, the eternal joy of the saved and the eternal punishment of the lost. (I Th 4:14-18; Acts 1:9-11; Mt 25:31-46)
- As believers, we have been given a universal commission to go into the entire world and preach the Gospel making disciples of all nations. These believers will lay hands on the sick and they shall recover. (Mk 16:15-20; Mt 28:18-20; Lk 24:47-49; Acts 1:8)
- God has set in his church, the five-fold ministry gifts of Apostles, Prophets, Evangelists, Pastors, and Teachers, for the purpose of equipping of the saints. These anointed believers, in turn, carry out the work of ministry, thus building up the Body of Christ. (Eph 4:10-16)

Mineola Bible Institute and Seminary specialize in Apostolic distance education. We offer both online courses and external studies by correspondence. We are authorized to grant degrees by exemption in the State of Texas.

The purpose of Mineola Bible Institute and Seminary is to educate gospel workers and ministers in Theology. Degrees offered at MBIS include Associate, Bachelor, Master, Doctorate in Theology, and the Doctor of Philosophy in Religion. More disciplines are coming soon. It is our arm to assist ministers and laymen in enhancing their education in Theology at a minimal cost.

MBIS realizes many full time Christians cannot leave their fields of labor to continue their education in Biblical studies, but many would appreciate an opportunity to expand their knowledge. The student will work at his/her own pace and can complete the prescribed courses in the comfort of their own home.

We will be sending you directed studies and a research program. These courses will be beneficial to you and your Church for many years to come. Many Churches have already expressed an interest in underwriting their pastor's expense in earning his degree in Theology.

We will accept previously accrued college credits earned in the areas of Biblical studies and theology, and give credits for the number of years in the Ministry (20 years, maximum). All students must start on the Associate level unless approval is given by the Admissions Board to start at a higher level.

Position Statement on Secular Accreditation

Secular Accreditation by the State of Texas or the U.S. Department of Education is not necessary for the theological degrees which we offer.

Generally speaking, people working in ministry positions do not need a secularly accredited degree. Government-recognized accreditation is not necessary for the religious vocations we are training people in, which include: Biblical Studies, Theology, and Ministry.

If you are pursuing education at MBIS with the intent of obtaining licensing, employment or for some other reason, you should check with that organization BEFORE applying for enrollment in MBIS. MBIS assumes no responsibility or liability of any kind.

Individuals seeking employment in government-licensed positions such as public school teachers, state-licensed psychologists or psychiatrists, and non-church-related counselors need government-recognized accredited degrees. Generally, people working in ministry positions do not need a government-accredited degree. In fact, many churches take a stand against the Church voluntarily placing itself under government regulations.

- There is secular education and there is religious education.
- Religious schools are not legally required to become accredited
- Secular schools seek secular education, and sacred schools receive sacred or ecclesiastic accreditation—each by their own peers.
- Religious institutions need no secular accreditation because they offer no secular degrees.
- Secular accreditation associations, in turn, are recognized by governmental agencies. They trace their authority back to the capital of a country, like Washington, D.C.
- Religious accrediting associations are recognized by the Church of Jesus Christ, which has no supreme central office on earth. Our authority is derived directly from Heaven.
- Civil and religious interests are different and have separate realms of jurisdiction.
- The State is not superior to the Church. The Church need not wait for approval from the secular world.

- Civil agencies should not be dictating standards of Christian education, any more than a police officer should be directing the worship of God.
- Theological Seminaries should not be accredited by accrediting associations that are “recognized” by an agency of the federal government, because it is contrary to the Biblical principle of “Separation of Church and State,” indicated by Christ when He said, “...Render unto Caesar the things that are Caesar’s and to God the things that are God’s...” (Mark 12:17).
- What business does a Christian educator have going to the world of unbelievers for recognition and acknowledgment when 2 Corinthians 6:14 clearly tells us, “Be ye not unequally yoked together with unbelievers: for what fellowship hath righteousness with unrighteousness?”
- A Christian educational institution securing accreditation from an association which is attached to a governmental agency is a Scripturally condemned and unholy union as James 4:4 says, “Ye adulterers and adulteresses, know ye not that the friendship of the world is enmity with God?”

Why not become accredited by the Department of Education? In many cases, the government’s Department of Education is not qualified to accredit a private school, such as a Bible School, because the DOE is secular and a Bible or Christian School is spiritual thus our standards are not secular and cannot be judged by secular standards!

As we find in 1 Corinthians 2:14 “But the natural man receiveth, not the things of the Spirit of God: for they are foolishness unto him: neither can he know them, because they are spiritually discerned.” Therefore a state agency is not able to determine if a spiritually directed learning institution is meeting the mandates of the Bible!

Accreditation has many benefits for both educational institutions and students, but it is neither a guaranty nor is it the sole criterion of an excellent education. Every accredited institution was once unaccredited. For example, Dallas Theological Seminary (DTS) was founded in 1924 but was not accredited by SACS until 1969, long after the graduation of notables such as Dwight Pentecost, Charles Ryrie, and Chuck Swindoll. Dallas Theological Seminary was not accredited by ATS until 1994, but its excellent education before then is unassailable.

Where promotional material for an unaccredited institution consists of an advertisement in a periodical published by a person or entity that is not affiliated with the unaccredited institution, the disclosure required in subsection (a) may be abbreviated to state as follows **NOT ACCREDITED BY AN AGENCY RECOGNIZED BY THE U.S. SECRETARY OF EDUCATION.** The disclosure required under this subsection shall be made in a type size as large or larger than any other text in the advertisement.

Mineola Bible Institute and Seminary is not accredited, and has no plans to pursue any type of secular accreditation for the following particular reasons: (1) to keep our expenses low, enabling MBIS to maintain its very low tuition rates – pursuit of accreditation would require a dramatic increase in costs passed on to the student; (2) to maintain doctrinal autonomy, and (3) to continue the utilization of MBIS-educated faculty to ensure theological and philosophical consistency with the doctrinal statement and mission of MBIS. The pursuit of accreditation would make this increasingly difficult.

Finally, we believe the quality of our programs is evident, and MBIS graduates will be distinguished by their maturity, understanding, and skill in exegetical and expositional disciplines. We believe our programs are of the highest quality, and we are committed to continuous improvement in the academic realm, and therefore we believe that prospective students or any students transferring from other institutions will be impressed by the academic standards of Mineola.

Admissions

Mineola Bible Institute and Seminary admit students of any race, color, national or ethnic origin. All courses will be presented in English only. The application should be completed and returned with a check or money order made payable to Mineola Bible Institute and Seminary.

Each application will be evaluated by the Admissions Board.

Applicants should be at least 16 years old to enter the degree program.

Transfers

An official transcript should be submitted from the appropriate school if a student desires credit to be granted toward a diploma in Theology. A copy of other degrees or diplomas will be sufficient. Credit will be granted when an evaluation is complete. We reserve the right of refusal to transfer credit for any course that we feel to be non-applicable to the student's course of study in Theology.

Life experience Credit

Life experience credit will be granted where appropriate. A complete packet must be requested and submitted giving documented proof (certificates, etc.) for credit desired. Credits will be given for the number of years in the ministry, with a maximum of 20 credits for 20 years in the ministry. Packets should be typed and submitted with the application. There is a \$25 evaluation fee for this service and \$20 per credit hour awarded. Please allow approximately 1 week for an evaluation.

Withdrawal

Withdrawal must be done by submitting a formal letter to MBIS stating the reason for the withdrawal.

Transcripts

All Transcripts from other Colleges or Institutes must show the number of courses taken, grades, and time of enrollment, official seal, official signatures, and addresses and phone numbers for verification. Students must provide these transcripts; it is not the responsibility of MBIS to obtain them for the student. Do not send applications and transcripts to us by e-mail; please mail them to us for our review.

Financial Information

The total tuition costs include all printed course materials, and academic counseling services. There is a \$25.00, non-refundable registration fee for all degrees.

We reserve the right to increase tuition prices to meet economic changes when necessary. All enrollment applications are dated to comply with the price changes. Courses will be sent upon receipt of payment.

Payment may be made by Check/Money Order or PayPal.

All payments must be in U.S. Currency.

Refund Policy

All refund requests must be submitted in writing by the student to the College by regular mail or by email. All refunds are made by check within 15 calendar days from the date of receipt of such a request.

- A partial tuition refund will be available for the first two weeks of class.
- Week 1 withdrawals are entitled to a 90% tuition refund.
- Week 2 withdrawals are entitled to an 80% tuition refund.
- There is no refund if withdrawal occurs after the first 2 weeks of class.
- All fees are non-refundable.

Enrollment

Request the new student packet and return it with the application fee and tuition payment. Be sure to indicate the program level you are pursuing and the payment plan you intend to use.

Major Prophets 3 Credit Hours

OT 102--The Major Prophets will be examined in-depth as to the message and messenger. The historical setting and future applications are also discussed.

Minor Prophets 3 Credit Hours

OT 103--The Minor Prophets will be examined in-depth as to the message and messenger. The historical setting and future applications are also discussed.

The Tabernacle 3 Credit Hours

OT 104-- An in-depth study of the Tabernacle in the wilderness. The meaning of its construction.

New Testament Studies

The Life of Christ 4 Credit Hours

NT 206-- An in-depth study of the life and miracles of Christ; the disciples, and parables are discussed.

The Gospels 3 Credit Hours

NT101-- An in-depth study of the four Gospels: Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John.

The Epistles 3 Credit Hours

NT103-- This course is an in-depth study of the General Epistles, Prison Epistles, and the Pastoral Epistles.

The Life of Paul 4 Credit Hours

NT109-- This course is an in-depth study of the life of the Apostle Paul; from his conversion, missionary travels, to the end of his life in Rome.

The Ministry of Paul 4 Credit Hours

BI 4108--This course covers the doctrines of Paul, his letter to the churches. Did Paul baptize in Jesus' name? Did Paul speak in tongues? Did Paul teach the Roman way to salvation in Romans as some teach today?

Acts 3 Credit Hours

NT102-- An in-depth study of the early Church, the journeys of St. Paul, and the spreading of the Gospel to the Gentile world.

Revelation 4 Credit Hours

BI 437 This course explains the Book of Revelation verse by verse, exploring the highly symbolic book in view of the end times.

Daniel 4 Credit Hours

BI 338 This course explains the Book of Daniel verse by verse and deals with the unfilled prophecy for our end-time generation.

Woe, Woe, Woe 4 Credit Hours

BI 9137 This course covers the three woes mentioned in Revelation. The first woe under the fifth trumpet, demon creatures will be loosed out of the pit to torment men for five months (Rev. 9:1-12). The second woe under the sixth trumpet, two hundred million demon horsemen will come out of the abyss to slay one-third of men at a certain hour (Rev. 9:13-21). The third woe, under the seventh trumpet, Satan and his wicked angels are cast out of heaven (second heaven) onto the earth (Rev. 11:14-19 12:1-9).

History**Church History I 4 Credit Hours**

HS 311 This course discusses the events from the book of Acts to the Reformation period.

Church History II 4 Credit Hours

HS 312 This course covers the events from the Reformation period to our modern times.

The Didache 3 Credit Hours

HS 993 This course deals with the early history of the Didache, its chapters, and what the major sources reveal about this work.

The 400 Silent Years 4 Credit Hours

HS 413 This course discusses the years between the Testaments from the close of Malachi to the birth of Jesus Christ.

Ancient Hebrew History 4 Credit Hours

HS 550 This Course covers in detail the history of the birth of Israel to the destruction under the Roman empire.

Historical Facts and Findings 2 Credit Hours

HS 853 This Course acquaints the student with historical and Biblical facts such as The Ark of the Covenant, The Breastplate of the High Priest, the Ephod, Shibboleth, the Shield of David, the Silver Cord, the Talmud, and Urim & Thumim, etc. Many other facts are presented to the student.

Ancient Biblical History

HS x50 This Course covers brief descriptions of the ancient world from the Neolithic Age to the time of Christ around 20 A.D.

Apostolic History Outline 4 Credit Hours

HS 814 This course covers the outlines of the history of the Apostolic Church from Pentecost to our present day. Originally written by Dr. Marvin Arnold.

Patrology I 6 Credit Hours

HS 9110 This course covers the Post-apostolic Fathers of the Church, Doctors of the Church, Apologetics, Apostolic Succession, the Fathers and the Trinity, such as Ambrose, Aquinas, Athanasius, Augustine, Basil, Chrysostom, Clement, Constantine, Cyril, Eusebius, Gregory, Hilary, etc.

Patrology II 6 Credit Hours

HS 9112 This course is the continuation of Patrology I. The Fathers discussed are: Ignatius, Irenaeus, Jerome, Josephus, Justin Martyr, Leo, Marcion, Origen, Papias, Polycarp, Tatian, Tertullian, Victor, etc.

Creeds & Councils 6 Credit Hours

HS 9116 This course covers the Apostles' Creed, Athanasian Creed, Church & State, Nicene Creed, Papal Bull, Roman Catholic Church, Council of Carthage, Council of Chalcedon, Council of Constance, Council of Ephesus, Council of Laodicea, Lateran Councils, Council of Nicaea, Council of Sardica, Council of Trent, etc.

Church History Outlines 4 Credit Hours

HS 9117 This course covers Church History from 1 A.D. to the present. A summary Timeline of Christianity.

The Star of David 4 Credit Hours

HS 915 This Course deals with the flag of Israel, its origin, the Shema, the Shem ha-Meforash, and presents the oneness message from a different perspective.

Jerusalem 4 Credit Hours

HS 9133 This course covers the early history of Jerusalem in the time of David, through the centuries, and modern Jerusalem today. The end-time prophecies concerning Jerusalem are discussed.

The Works of Josephus

HS 9127 Covers the Antiquities of the Jews, The Jewish Wars & the Jewish History in general by Josephus.

The Works of Philo 4 Credit Hours

HS x84 This course deals with the works of Philo of Alexandria (20 BCE - 40 CE).

Bible Backgrounds

Important Bible Women 3 Credit Hours

BB 231 This course is designed to increase the student's knowledge of some of the major women in the Bible.

Bible Men 3 Credit Hours

BB 246 This Course covers the most important men in the Bible.

Everyone in the Bible 3 Credit Hours

BB 241 This course examines everyone mentioned in the Bible from A to Z.

Bible Geography I

BB 316 This Course covers Old Testament geography, primarily pertaining to Palestine and Jerusalem.

Bible Geography II

BB 317 This course covers the Middle East of the New Testament and the journeys of St. Paul.

Geography III

BB 883 This course acquaints the student with the geography and history of Syria, Rome, Greece, Egypt, Babylon, Iraq, Kuwait, etc.

Bible Customs 3 Credit Hours

BB 318 This Course course explains the customs of Bible times.

Israel 6 Credit Hours

BB 769 This Course acquaints the student with detailed information on the nation of Israel. The Course covers past history, the political parties, a country profile, the founding fathers of Zionism, Israeli settlements, etc.

Biblical Archaeology 4 Credit Hours

BB 519 This course covers archaeology in Bible lands. The Course presents discoveries such as Tutankhamen's Tomb, the store-city of Pharaoh, Ramses II, King Hammurabi's law-code, the Walls of Jericho, Solomon's buildings, King Hezekiah's Tunnel, Nebuchadnezzar of Babylon, Alexander of Macedon, the hidden city of Petra, the Dead Sea Scrolls, etc.

The Jewish Feasts 3 Credit Hours

BB 755 This Course covers the seven feasts of the Jews and shows the prophetic perspective of each feast. The Course covers the Passover, Firstfruits, Pentecost, Feast of Trumpets, Day of Atonement, Feast of Tabernacles, Feast of Purim, Feast of Lights, and Feast of Unleavened Bread. The course also deals with the three days and nights of Christ in the tomb, the Hebrew calendar, and the major holidays of Israel.

Ministry

50 Sermons For Saints & Sinners 4 credit Hours

MI 540 This course is a collection of sermons by Dr. Vestal to be used in the student's ministry in winning souls for Jesus Christ.

Top 15 Sermons 3 Credit Hours

MI 4103 15 Sermons preached by Rev. D.R. Vestal, especially useful for those incarcerated. The most requested top 15 sermons presented by Dr. Vestal.

Sermons in Nutshells 3 Credit Hours

MI 9120 This Course material acquaints the student with over 500 sermon outlines which can be used in their ministry.

Women in the Ministry 4 Credit Hours

MI x125 This Courses covers subjects such as planning, money, timing, and preparation, respecting authority, discriminating, having a questionable background, critics, mentorship, betrayal, temptation, misjudging, the law of repetition, correcting mistakes, the power of habit, education, toleration, rebellion, confrontations, delegation, sowing, and reaping, etc. Many other topics discussed in being a Christian leader.

Ministry Notes 4 Credit Hours

MI x130 This Course is presented by Bishop Donald R. Vestal, contents include The Church Congregation, Articles of Incorporation, Articles of Faith, Church By-Laws, Church Finance, Church Pastor, Church Services, Church Music, Altar Services, Anointing With Oil, Water Baptisms, Baby Dedications, Foot Washings, Communion Services, Church Education, Funerals, Weddings, Church Dedications, Hospital Visits, Nursing Home Visits, Visitation and Outreach, Home Bible Study, Life of Pastor Vestal and Ministry.

Ministerial Ethics 4 Credit Hours

MI 888 This course deals with the minister & his ministry, the pastor & his church, the minister & Evangelists relationship, the minister & his personal life, the minister & his family, the minister's spiritual life, the minister & his home, the minister & his pulpit, the

minister & his colleagues, the minister & his organization, the minister & social problems, etc.

Divine Healing and Health 3 Credit Hours

MI x134 This Course covers divine healing & health as outlined in the Bible. Is it God's will for Christians to be sick? Are healing miracles for the church today? Causes of not getting healing. Excuses for not getting healing. God's will and promises for the church today concerning health and healing.

Church Government 4 Credit Hours

MI x128 This Course covers different church governments within churches today, Denominational, Presbyterian, Congregational, etc. God's government versus man's government. Elders, Prophets, Bishops, etc.

Tongues

MI 442 This course deals with speaking in other tongues as practiced by the Apostles and the early Church. We explore tongues in the church of today.

Spiritual Gifts 3 Credit Hours

MI 347 This course covers the gifts of the Spirit mentioned in Romans 12:6-8, such as prophecy, ministry, teaching, exhortation, giving, leading, and showing mercy. It also covers the gifts in Ephesians 4:11, The Five-Fold Ministry, apostolic, prophetic, evangelical, pastoral, and teacher. It also covers the 9 gifts of the Spirit in I Corinthians 12:1-4, wisdom, knowledge, discerning of spirits, speaking in tongues, interpretation of tongues, prophecy, faith, miracles, and healing. All gifts used in the church body for edification.

Public Speaking 3 Credit Hours

MI x113 This course covers public speaking, some short styles of a short talk, forms of public speaking, discussion and debate, argument and persuasion, forms of oral interpretation and delivery.

Business Communication 3 Credit Hours

MI x128 This course covers letters, computers, phones, emails, the Internet, business documents, oral & written communications, etc.

World Missions

U. S. A. Religions 4 credit Hours

WM 632 This course examines the basic structure of the religions in the United States.

World Religions 4 Credit Hours

WM 633 This course examines the world's religions and major cults.

Religions & Religious Groups 6 Credit Hours

WM 9107 This course covers Religious Groups from A to Z. Such groups as Anabaptists, Calvinism, Christian Science, Church of England, Donatism, Druze, Franciscans, Fundamentalism, Huguenots, Jesuits, Knights Templars, Lollards, Orthodox Church, Pentecostal Church, Plymouth Brethren, Separatists, Waldenses, etc.

Theology

Theology I 4 credit Hours

TH 620 This course covers demonology and subjects concerning the Church.

Theology II 4 Credit Hours

TH 621 This course covers Angelology and the 7 divisions of the periods of the Old Testament.

Theology III 4 credit Hours

TH 674 This course deals with terms and expressions used in Theology. It gives the student a better understanding of words such as anthropomorphism, antinomianism, cabala, eschatology, Gnosticism, Monarchianism, monotheism, mysticism, pantheism, polytheism, theism, etc. The course also deals with the branches of Theology, theosophy, transubstantiation, and Unitarianism.

Comparative Theology 3 Credit Hours

TH 9124 This course discusses and compares the theology of the Brahmin, the Buddhist, the Greeks, and the Romans, the Israelite & Ishmaelite and the Aboriginal American.

Essential Theology 3 Credit Hours

TH 9126 This course discusses the issues of the God-idea, a mediator, the incarnation, the need for a sacrifice, the authority of Essential Theology, and the origin and significance of Essential Theology.

Trinity or Truth 4 Credit Hours

TH 322 This Course shows the error of the Trinity doctrine and presents the truth of Monotheism. Many questions asked by Trinitarians are dealt with in this Course.

The Truth of the Oneness Doctrine 4 Credit Hours

TH 423 This doctrinal course is a rebuttal to a major Trinitarian, who has written a book indicating the oneness people are heresy.

Resources on the Trinity 3 Credit Hours

TH360 Definitions of the Trinity by Major Encyclopedias, Trinitarian Authors' view of the Trinity, The Mode of Water Baptism, Re-Examining the Great Commission of Matthew 28:19.

The Trinity Development 3 Credit Hours

TH 887 Shows the development of the trinity doctrine through the first four centuries and the men who brought this about.

The Divided God 4 Credit Hours

TH 101 A carefully researched and easy to read presentation of Apostolic Doctrine and refutation of the Doctrine of the Trinity presenting an alternative more in keeping with the Scriptures.

Christology 4 Credit Hours

TH 628 This course covers: The meaning of Christ's death, discovered Soteriologically, the deity of Christ, the humanity of Christ, the hypostatic union, the kenosis, the work of Christ, the relation of Jesus to the Father, the glorification of the Son.

Trinity Origin Research 3 Credit Hours

TH 765 This course is presented by Dr. Vestal on his research on the origin of the Trinity doctrine. Quotes from major Encyclopedias and Theologians show that the Trinity doctrine is in error. Dr. Vestal also rebuts, in writing, the theology of Calvin Beisner, and the late, Dr. Walter Martin.

Pneumatology 4 Credit Hours

TH 629 This Course covers: The baptism of the Holy Spirit, Speaking in tongues, the study of the diversity of tongues, the evidence of tongues, the nature of the Spirit, How to distinguish between soul and Spirit, the name of Jesus Christ.

God & Free Will

TH 9138 This course deals with moral law, choices, justice, the philosophy of redemption, does God exist, wrong & right decisions, is man a free moral agent, moral education, value analysis, etc.

Bibliology 4 Credit Hours

TH 630 This course covers subjects such as The nature of inspiration, Biblical languages, A history of the English Bible, How we get our Bible, Defending the inerrancy and canon of Scripture, Bible Translations, The NIV, etc.

Bible Doctrine

Bible Doctrine I 4 Credit Hours

BD 524 This course covers: Elohim & the plural passages of Scripture, the sons of God in Genesis, Yahweh or Jesus, is Jesus God the Father, the dual nature of Christ.

Bible Doctrine II 4 Credit Hours

BD 525 This course covers The Logos, the vision of St. Stephen, the question of titles, plural pronouns used for God, the voice & the dove at Christ's baptism, understanding the Father, Son, and the Holy Spirit.

Bible Doctrine III 4 Credit Hours

BD 526 This course covers: Was it possible for Jesus to sin?, Justification & Sanctification, the prayers of Jesus.

Bible Doctrine IV 4 Credit Hours

BD 527 This course covers: The originality of Matthew 28:19, A close examination of Matthew 28:19 in light of early Christian writers, the development of the Trinity doctrine, the Godhead, is the Trinity fact or fiction?

General Education

Psychology I

GE x75 This deals with topics such as depression, moods, educational psychology, industrial psychology, mental disorders, perception, psychoanalysis, schizophrenia, etc.

Philosophy I

GE 772 This Course acquaints the student with Greek philosophy, the different branches of philosophy, Chinese philosophy, ethics, free will, logic, metaphysics, modernism, Western philosophy, scholasticism, etc.

Advanced Philosophy II

GE x118 This course of study is presented to the student to show how Alexander the Great and his mother influenced the Grecian world. Alexander & his teachings were from Aristotle, Plato, and his cultic mother. Rev. Vestal shows how the trinity doctrine was influenced by Platonic & Grecian philosophy.

Chemical Dependence

Deviant Behaviors

DB-111. This Course covers some deviant behaviors such as Adultery, Homosexuals, Prostitutes, Bestiality, Pedophiles, Pornography, Rape, Suicide, Alcoholics, Criminals,

Transsexuals, Witchcraft, etc.

Venereal Diseases

Sociology II

D-76-1A This course covers the subjects of Sociology, Socialization, Social Role, Social Psychology, Social Science, Social Work, Social Class, Sociobiology, Anthropology, Criminology, Demography, Ecology, Education, Human Relations, Humanism, Language, Law, Linguistics, Political Science, and Urban Sociology.

Adult Development

CA-B-99 This course deals with the stages of adult development from adolescence to old age. It covers marriage, divorce, work-related problems, and retirement. It deals with stress and anxiety of old age adjustments, death of a spouse, and establishing living arrangement including Nursing Homes, and death.

Child Development

SS x62 This course covers the Old and New Covenants, is Saturday the Sabbath or Sunday, are we required to keep Saturday as the Sabbath. Did the apostles keep the Sabbath? Which day are we to observe today as the Sabbath? Which is the Lord's day?

Creation vs. Evolution I 4 Credit Hours

SS 435 This course deals with Similarities, Fossils and Geology, Biochemistry, Embryology, Design vs. Evolution, Chromosomes, Prehistoric man, and how your decision about evolution may be directive in your life.

Christian Marriage & Divorce

SS 7119 This course deals with the marriage institution, does God hate divorce? divorce and remarriage, Godly submission in marriage, verbal abuse in the marriage, can Christians remarry in the Lord after a divorce, widowhood, etc.

The Principles of Christian Living 3 Credit Hours

SS 234 This Course is designed to inform the student how to live a Christian life. Subjects discussed are: What is a Christian? How to grow in the Christian life, the Christian and the Holy Spirit, the Christian and the Bible, how to pray as a Christian, the Christian, and the Church, and the Christian and their finances.

God's Astronomy 4 Credit Hours

SS 561 This course covers the true meaning of the 12 signs of the Zodiac. The course covers Psalms 19, the 12 signs of the Zodiac in relation to the 12 tribes of Israel, and the 12 months on the Hebrew calendar. The planets of our solar system are also discussed.

Predestination 3 Credit Hours

SS 791 This course covers subjects such as the Definition of Predestination, Theological Determinism, Free Will in Theology, Calvinism & Predestination, Theological Fatalism, Fatalism, Providentialism, and Divine Providence.

Ancient Archaeology Discoveries 3 Credit Hours

SS 768 This Course covers ancient finds such as The Rosetta Stone, the Behistun Inscription, the Moabite Stone, the Code of Hammurabi, the city of Ur, the Nuzi Tablets, the Mari Letters, the Dead Sea Scrolls, etc.

Christian Growth & Development 3 Credit Hours

SS x92 This Course acquaints the student with overcoming daily problems and offenses. How to form attitudes about ourselves and others. It covers the four basic structures of authority, how to have and maintain a clear conscience, the consequence of bitterness, and the development of reprobation, etc.

The Occult 4 Credit Hours

SS 545 This Course acquaints the student to occult terms and phrases of witchcraft. It

covers topics such as Fortune Telling, Black Mass, Clairvoyance, Demons, Divination, Nature Worship, Fire Worship, Horoscopes, Sorcery, Palmistry, Spiritualism, etc. All of these are tools of Satan to deceive the souls of mankind.

Hermeneutics 4 Credit Hours

SS 543 This course deals with the Principles and Processes of Biblical Interpretation, Subjects included are Historical-Cultural and Contextual Analysis, Lexical-Syntactical Analysis, Theological Analysis, Special Literary Methods, and Applying the Biblical Message.

Bible Standards 4 Credit Hours

SS 951 This course deals with Bible holiness, concepts of dress, jewelry, hair, the role of women in the church, ministerial authority, and legalism.

Christian Growth II 3 Credit Hours

SS 349 This course covers forgiveness, letting go of the past, the transmutation of riches, the necessity of unity, sound speech, the power of praise, how to relax, how to have peace, showing mercy, controlling your thoughts, how to master self-consciousness, getting along with neighbors, etc.

UFO Research & the Bible 3 Credit Hours

SS 767 This course deals with the UFO sightings and uses Scripture to prove their existence. The text covers the future UFO invasion of our earth, the cleansing of the 2nd heavens prior to the 2nd coming of Christ at Armageddon. This course is a great eye-opener for our generation.

Abortion 4 Credit Hours

SS 952 This Course covers the Biblical response to abortion, the one exception for abortion, Pro-choice, Embryos, etc.

Parental Responsibilities 3 Credit Hours

SS x39 This course covers the responsibilities of raising children from childhood through the teenage years. Deals with sex, drugs, and other responsibilities of the parent.

Where Are The Dead? 6 Credit Hours

SS 956 Are the dead conscious? Will we recognize one another in Heaven? What is revealed about Paradise? What is revealed about Heaven? How many resurrections are there? What will the body be like in the resurrection? Does the Bible teach there is a Hell? Is there a second chance after death? Will the unrighteous be annihilated? Will we have a memory of lost loved ones in Hell? Is there marriage in Heaven? Can the living and the dead communicate? What is the truth of purgatory? Did Jesus preach to the spirits in prison? What is the truth about soul sleep? Is the rich man in Hell, a parable?

Textual Criticism I 4 Credit Hours

SS 558 This course covers the Hebrew Text of the Old Testament, The Greek Texts of the New Testament, The Unical Manuscripts, The Cursives, The Lectionaries, The Church Fathers, Early Translations, The Papyrus Fragments, Conjectures of Scholars, Sermons of Early Preachers, Establishment of the Textus Receptus, Periods of Discovery and Research, Periods of Constructive Criticism, Westcott and Hort, External Evidence, Internal Evidence, etc.

Textual Criticism II 4 Credit Hours

SS 559 This course covers introduction to Church History, Catholic doctrine of the Trinity, "Son of God" interpolations, the name of God, Ehyeh Asher Ehyeh, Jehovah, Yeshua, Elohim, The English name of God, and many Catholic Encyclopedias regarding the development of the Trinity in the second and third centuries.

Yahweh or Yeshua?

SS x131 This course deals with the original name of God as given to Moses, Yahweh or Yeshua. Explains the Tetragrammaton, the Moabite Stone, Zeus-Dionysus, the J document, etc.

Languages

Greek Word Studies 6 Credit Hours

LS 866 This course introduces the student to the Greek alphabet and introduces the most important words used in the New Testament and their Greek rendering.

Greek II 6 Credit Hours

LS 9109 This course deals with the Greek alphabet, Greek vowels, breathing marks, accent marks, punctuation marks, adjectives, prepositions, verbs, participles, and pronouns.

Hebrew I 4 Credit Hours

LS 685 This course acquaints the student with the basics of the Hebrew alphabet and vowels.

The English Language 3 Credit Hours

LS 3111 This course covers good usage of the English language, correct use of some common words and phrases.

Doctoral Studies

Christian Marriage 3 Credit Hours

DS 770 This course deals with Marriage preparation and improvement. The role of religion in marriage. The purpose of marriage. The permanence of marriage. Maturity in marriage. Responsibility, honesty, and self-control in marriage. Friends & in-laws in

marriage. The roles of husbands & wives in marriage. Raising children in marriage. Sexual purity.

The Monarch of the Books 3 Credit Hours

DS 748 This course deals with the defense of the 1611 A.D., Kings James Version Bible. Subjects include Greek texts, Manuscripts, Origen's Hexapla, the LXX, and the Alexandrian texts, etc.

Misc. Notes & Sayings 3 Credit Hours

DS 864 This course covers such subjects as Periods of Egyptian history, the names & meaning of the 12 spies, the Gates of Jerusalem, the 12 stones in the breastplate of the high priest, the names of each disciple and their meanings, Melchizedek, the God-head, the lost books mentioned in the Bible, the Apocrypha, the 29th chapter of Acts, etc.

Mythology 3 Credit Hours

DS 782 The myths dealing with the gods, demigods, and legendary heroes of various cultures.

The English Bible & Its Development 3 Credit Hours

DS 757 This course covers the Latin Bible, the Gutenberg Bible, the Tyndale Bible, the Coverdale Bible, the Great Bible, the Geneva Bible, the Bishop's Bible, the King James Bible, and the New versions of today.

Ancient Philosophers 3 Credit Hours

DS 873 This Course deals with famous philosophers, past and present, such men as Anaxagoras, Thomas Aquinas, Aristotle, Confucius, Maimonides, Marcus Aurelius, Philo Judaeus, Plato, Socrates, Voltaire, etc.

Doctor of Philosophy

The King James Version Bible 4 Credit Hours

PH 9102 This course was written by James Jackson and deals with the origin of the KJV Bible. It shows the superiority of the King James over the other Bible translations.

Tithing 3 Hours

PH 9122 This course deals with tithing from the Old Testament to the New Testament. The testimony of G.T. Haywood on this subject is superb.

Marriage & Homosexuality 4 Credit Hours

PH 9114 This Course covers the Biblical concept of marriage between a man and a woman and shows how homosexuality is against nature and the Word of God.

The Name & the Anointing 4 Credit Hours

PH 9104 This course was written by Shela Jones and deals with the Holy Ghost baptism, and the name of Jesus Christ.

Anthropology

PH 995 This Course deals with the study of humans from a biological, social, and humanistic perspective. The course acquaints the student with physical anthropology and sociocultural anthropology.

Doctrinal & Theoretical Isms 6 Credit Hours

PH 999 This Course deals with new scientific discoveries that support creationism. The Course covers Microbiology, Physics, Cosmetology, etc. The Course also deals with: Evolution, Fossils, Mutation, and Probability, etc.

Foxe's Book of Martyrs 6 Hours

PH 9100 This course deals with the history of early Christian martyrs such as John Wycliffe, John Huss, Jerome, William Tyndale, Martin Luther, Bishop Latimer, and many others.

Moral Philosophy 6 Hours

PH 996 This Course deals with character building and is outlined from A to Z for easy reference.

Themes & Theses**Themes for The Master Diploma 6 Hours**

TT 644 A total of 10 themes are required for the Old Testament using four reference works, plus 10 themes for the New Testament.

Jesus in Hell? 4 Credit Hours

TT 654 Total of ten pages required on the subject of whether Jesus went to hell after His death on the cross.

Doctoral Research Themes 6 Credit Hours

TT 871 This research is required for 18 themes to be researched and answered.

Doctoral Thesis 6 Credit Hours

TT 886 A thesis is required of your choosing, the thesis must be at least 20,000 words

in length.

Thesis On Jerusalem 4 Credit Hours

TT 997 This thesis is required of the student to trace the history of Jerusalem from its earliest beginnings to the present time. Who does the city belong to? What are the prophecies concerning this city?

Ph.D. in Religion Thesis 6 Credit Hours

TT 998 This 30-page thesis is required of the student on the subject of the development of the Trinity doctrine through the centuries and the men who brought this doctrine before the councils.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q: How long has MBIS been in ministry and how many graduates are there?

A: Mineola Bible Institute is an outgrowth and affiliate program of Cypress Bible Institute in Van, Texas. The Lord burdened Bishop D.R. Vestal, PhD to begin Cypress Bible Institute in 1991. Since that time, he has enrolled and/or graduated some 1000 students.

Q: How large is your campus?

A: MBIS operates strictly from the "college without walls" model using well proven distance educational study methods.

Q: What is the official doctrinal position of the Mineola Bible Institute and Seminary?

A: We are an apostolic, Pentecostal, teaching ministry. Our full Statement of Faith can be found on our website or in the Student Handbook.

Q: Does MBIS issue degrees?

A: Yes! MBIS issues degrees by exemption in the State of Texas.

Q: God has called me as a minister, but I know very little about it. Will your program equip me properly for that?

A: Yes! This program is very thorough; written *by* a minister especially *for* ministers. Several courses will lead you "by the hand" step by step with clear, easy to follow instructions on how to study, prepare, and preach sermons, how to baptize, conduct weddings, funerals, child dedications, communion services, and much more.

If you don't have one, we highly encourage you to obtain an "Old Scofield Study Bible" in the KJV. One can be purchased for around \$20 from Christian Book Distributors [www.christianbook.com].

Q. Why a Scofield Bible? Don't you disagree with its doctrinal stances?

A. While there are many areas in which we disagree with the doctrinal positions and notes of the Scofield Bible, the fact remains, it is virtually unsurpassed in the usefulness of its reference system. The Chain References, Topical Index, Names Index, Subject Index and comprehensive Concordance provide an extensive library of study and reference materials. The doctrinal positions of the Institute are clearly stated in our Statement of Faith and thoroughly taught in our course materials, so there is no confusion as to what we believe. (In brief, the Old Scofield Bible is recommended for its study system and not its doctrinal teachings).

Q: Can I receive credit for courses taken through other schools or from my ministry experience?

A: Yes, you can! You need to fill out the information requested in the Life Experience Portfolio (available upon request). Once evaluated, this will give you Advanced Standing into the next higher degree track. Example: if you enroll in the 60 hour Associate degree study track with (let's say) 60 hours of transferrable credits (college and life experience per analysis), you will have accumulated 120 hours upon completion and thus be eligible for a Bachelor of Theology (Th.B) rather than an Associate of Theology (Th.A) degree.

Q: Are text materials included in the cost of these programs.
